Yes, "The Time Is Short"




Taking Religion With Us


A Light for Those Who Give Light


Winning the Children for Christ



Baptist World Alliance Sunday

Baptists of the world are united in the Baptist World Alliance. It represents a world-wide fellowship and has no power over the local church or any of the constituent conventions. Through it Northern and Southern Baptists, Negro Baptists, Baptists on all continents, join forces to make our principles known in every land. Under the leadership of President C. Oscar Johnson the Alliance is making splendid progress.

Relief, Evangelism and Freedom

The Baptist World Alliance has a three-fold program: World Relief, Evangelism and Religious Liberty. "Clothes for a Million People and a Million Dollars for Food" is its aim in relief. An exchange of preachers has already begun in its field of evangelism. And the now famous "Manifesto on Religious Freedom," adopted by the Baptist World Congress at Copenhagen last summer has had wide circulation. A Commission on Religious Freedom is at work carrying out the principles of the "Manifesto."



Race Relations Sunday

It is an indictment against the Christian Church that the Federal Council of Churches thought it necessary or advisable to set aside one Sunday in the year as "Race Relations Sunday" to promote the ideal of brotherhood. This ideal should be so much a part of the every day practice of the Christian Church that setting aside one special day for "interracial fellowship" would be unnecessary.

However, since segregation does exist in some of our churches, it is good to have one day, one Sunday, when something constructive is done about racial prejudice. Many churches today are having guest ministers of another race in their pulpits. Other churches have invited as special guests groups of another race to share in their worship service.

Interracial mass meetings, forums, round tables, along with joint worship services and pulpit exchanges—may they all help to hasten the day when men will feel themselves to be brothers, no matter what their color of skin may be.

Brotherhood Week


This Sunday marks the beginning of American Brotherhood Week, observance of which was initiated fifteen years ago by the National Conference of Christians and Jews. Former Secretary of War Robert P. Patterson, this year's national chairman for Brotherhood Week, states that American unity is indispensable to world peace and can be realized only by a rejection of intolerance and an increasing prevalence of "the understanding and good will found in the bond of brotherhood."

"We Americans are committed to the cause of world peace. Words will not win world peace. We will not reach it unless we have a strong united nation here at home. And a strong united nation is an unattainable ideal unless we keep brotherhood as the guiding rule of our daily lives.

"Intolerance is bound to produce a divided people, a weak nation. We may be sure that we will never achieve a lasting peace on such terms.

"The unity we had in the war years, when we saw the losses and sorrows of war being borne by Americans without distinction as to race or religion, when it was plain to all of us that our spiritual aims and purposes were far more powerful than our differences, is still available as the vital force for peace. The understanding and goodwill found in the bond of brotherhood will bring us to realize that unity. I know of nothing else that can."

Northern Baptists, as followers of Christ, can do no less than to resolve anew to make brotherhood one of the guiding rules of their lives.

Every church school teacher and each church officer should be in the school if at all possible. A Baptist enrollment of 25 would not be more than should be expected.

Your minister will be the speaker at the noon-time Lenten services at St. Peter's this Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Have you reserved the first Sunday night in March? On that night we begin our part in the Northern Baptist Crusade for Christ. Every member should plan to attend.

Our sermon themes during Lent will follow the general thought of "The Transfiguration of Life." Last week we considered the transfiguration of Jesus, and today we begin to examine our own lives seeking to find means of transforming them into the "brightness of Christ". Next week we shall think of our home relationships in these terms: What is Christian marriage? What is a Christian home? How is it achieved?


B. Y. F. World Outreach

The Disciple Plan, the center and heart of the Baptist Youth Fellowship, is a realistic combination of Christ and young life linked in unselfish service. It is nowhere more apparent than in the B.Y.F. Missionary World Outreach program which is the major emphasis for February, March and April.

This Missionary World Outreach program is Baptist youth's "Adventure in Living and Giving." "Adventuring" in friendship, Baptist youth form interracial fellowship groups and participate in interracial color caravans.

"Adventuring" in service, B.Y.F. groups sponsor relief projects such as "All God's Children Need Shoes" and "Fellowship Carloads" of relief cereal for Europe and Asia, and B.Y.F. members serve as Youth Associates in Summer Assemblies and work in Summer Service projects.

Baptist youth also adventure in giving through their new "Youth Discipleship Sharing Plan" (youth budget). These programs have been developed because Baptist youth are alert to the needs of the world and want to be prepared to meet these needs at every call.

What chance did Jesus have . . . with an ecclesiastically inspired mob after Him and the empire's government supporting them with soldiery and a timid governor? Pilate knew better than to whip Him and to allow the rough military men to dress Him up, taunting Him all the while. He knew better than to expose Him as a caricature to the murderous intentions of the throng. But he wanted things to settle down in his domain so that unfavorable reports would not reach Rome.

When Pilate removed the last vestige of protection from Jesus and threw Him to the wolves, he did pronounce an injunction which will be remembered as long as the world endures: "Here is the man!" the Revised Standard Version puts it.

Here He is, the normal Man, the perfect human standard. Here He is, the Person about whose life age-long creeds have been written, the Son of God who alone can bring saving health to the souls of men and the ways they live together. Here He is, the perennially presented Christ, without a decision concerning whose eternal meaning for your life here and hereafter and for society, you cannot grow up.

The first century crowd cried out, "Crucify Him, crucify Him!" Too many in the twentieth century have joined them. But many have declared, "I'll follow Him!" What have you done? What will you do?

The ancient name given to the day Christ established the Lord's Supper. It refers to the washing of the feet of the Disciples. We observe it with a Communion conducted about tables in silence and candle light.

What is Good Friday?

The day good was done for us upon the Cross. It is expected that Christians will refrain from work or pleasure from the hours 12 until 3:00; the period of Jesus' suffering.


Christianity's Great Day


Principles of Yesterday



This Is Baptist Education Day

"Of greatest importance today is the place of the Christian college in our American Democracy," declared Dr. Walter Pope Binns, President of William Jewell College, in a statement on the observance of Baptist Education Day. Amplifying this declaration, President Binns continued, "The war accelerated scientific progress and attracted attention to technical and vocational education, but it also revealed the desperate need for spiritual culture. Our chief problem today is that scientific progress has outrun spiritual development. We must develop moral sense enough to control these forces which our scientific genius has released, or else there is danger that the very creatures of our hands will prove to be our destruction."

Today the 63 Baptist-related schools, colleges and seminaries and the Baptist university pastor centers join with the churches of the Northern Baptist Convention in giving serious thought to problems of recruiting and training strong Christian leadership for tomorrow's world. In all sections of the denomination, college presidents, university pastors and student groups will be guests of the churches so that the congregations may experience close kinship with our educational forces in facing the common task of training tomorrow's pastors, missionaries, educators and laymen. . . . All this to the end that spiritual progress shall keep abreast of scientific development and that Christ's Kingdom may triumph.


The Unseen Guest

All of us sing Frank Mason Worth's "Hymn of the City":


"Where cross the crowded ways of life,

Above the Turmoil

Above the turmoil, and yet in it! That is the church of Christ. Planted in a storm, and yet towering above the storm! How desperately men yearn for reassurance regarding such an institution in times like these. Can the church of Jesus Christ fulfill that function now? Of course it can, but the pressing question is, will it? Certainly not if it continues to remain indifferent to its leadership need at a time when the demand for leadership becomes so frightfully

urgent.

This ought to become a matter of real concern to us Northern Baptists. We represent one of the major Protestant bodies in America. There are a million and a half of us. We are gathered together in more than 7000 churches. These churches require a pastoral leadership. About 5300 pastors are needed to keep the pulpits of these churches supplied. The average pastor remains about 24 years in pastoral service. It means that merely to maintain the present supply about 225 to 250 pastors must be ordained each year to replace those who die or retire. A similar number is needed each year to meet the demand for directors of Christian education, settlement workers, evangelists, missionaries, teachers of religion in schools and colleges. Our denomination has 10 seminaries engaged in the task of training this leadership but the seminaries are limited to what the churches send them. Our churches dare not longer be neglectful about its increasingly grave responsibility at this point. Indifference to our leadership needs is the sure way to spell disaster for the future. 
Now which of these two do the most for the city . . . the churches or the breweries?

Christian Friendliness

How often we have been guilty of lack of cordiality and even open dislike in our meager attempts to reach those "other sheep" about whom our Lord was deeply concerned. "Them also I must bring," He said. Christian Friendliness is a way of seeking some of them: those whose skin color differs from our own, whose names are dissimilar, whose language is foreign.

Christian Friendliness missionaries discover needs in the lives of newcomers to America, war brides, D. P.'s, students from abroad. They recognize realistically economic inequalities which the color line imposes. They search for Baptist volunteers whose dedication to the Shepherd will equip them to carry His Gospel into these unlovely areas of human relationships. Missionaries and volunteers break down barriers through interracial clubs, they "set the captives free" by teaching simple English or citizenship lessons. They seek to hurdle inequalities by working for laws which will protect the rights of all people. They know that by these means they make their friends aware that the door of the fold is open. Not all who are invited enter in, but all experience the glow of feeling wanted. Some do enter, as many have, to find the joy of fellowship with the Shepherd. As a department of the Woman's American Baptist Home Mission Society, Christian Friendliness justifies its share of the Unified Budget through consistent worth while efforts to bring some of the "other sheep" into the fold.


Days in the Open with God




Birth of the United Nations


It is not uncommon for those who love the Lord to pray daily for the coming of a great revival. Such a revival could come in our day and with even greater power than any similar movement in the memory of man. The very fact that so many bodies of Christian people the world around are now becoming concerned about the "lost" condition of men and society may have tremendous spiritual significance for the days that lie ahead

If a revival of truly revolutionary proportions should come in our day, would it necessarily have to employ the same external methods as those in the past? Might it not be possible that the next great spiritual awakening may come out of a more potent spirit of evangelism pervading the forces of Christian education and by means of what we

think of as educational evangelism?

Be this as it may, the stark fact remains that Christianity is always just one generation removed from mass extinction. It has to be taught . . . in every last generation or die! Dr. Elmer Homrighausen, Princeton Seminary, has said, "No one inherits Christianity biologically, nor does one become a Christian by proxy." So far as Christian faith and character are concerned, every newborn babe must literally start from scratch. Whatever he attains he will acquire from his surroundings and his experiences in it. Herein lies the glorious opportunity and the sacred responsibility of every Christian teacher and parent.

Winning America for Christ

Some of us are startled when we realize that one-half of the people in America are beyond the reach of churches. People are out of reach of the churches when they move into newly built sections of the city, or when they live in isolated rural areas, or when they are separated from church congregations by barriers of language, race, or even poverty. Many others simply have a pattern of life that leaves God out, and so the church is ignored.

The American Baptist Home Mission Society and the Woman's American Baptist Home Mission Society represent Northern Baptists in their evangelistic Mission to people of America who otherwise would not have the Gospel preached to them. The home mission agencies work through Christian Centers for underprivileged people, Missions to Indians, churches erected in new building developments, aid to pastors in communities that cannot support a ministry, missionaries sent to those who have a foreign language background, educational centers among Negroes, guidance for rural churches, missions to Latin America and Alaska and an evangelistic program for all churches.

The Crusade for Christ through Evangelism is a program to help the churches to evangelize the people whom they can reach. The Ten Day Cooperative Crusades now being held in many churches are a part of that program to win America for Christ.

Christmas at Moanza, Belgian Congo

Rev. and Mrs. Eugene Abbot report on last year's Christmas in Moanza: "Christmas activities began on December 18 with a Sunday service and pageant for and by the school children. On Monday, a field day with games, contests and field events was held. The thing that was more strenuous for the winners than the contest itself was the selection of their prizes from the table of prizes. Numerous things were selected from White Cross boxes so the selection was such as to suit different tastes, but the big question was 'What do I want most?' Tuesday morning saw much activity as places were prepared, food cooked and other preparations made for the Christmas feast for the school children, station employees and hospital patients and staff. After the close of school for vacation the following day we had comparative quiet for several weeks. Christmas week we entertained the missionaries from Vanga. We must just mention our Christmas eve celebration, beginning with a buffet supper and followed by the opening of our gifts (Santa was surely good to us in the things he had gathered from many parts of the world); Christmas morning when we opened our stockings; Christmas service in the church, followed by the Festive Board with wild pig and all the trimmings. Yes, Christmas can be celebrated even under a tropical sun, in all places where Jesus Christ has a place, for one must not forget that He was and is the greatest gift to all who call upon Him as Lord and Savior."


Making Christmas Meaningful


