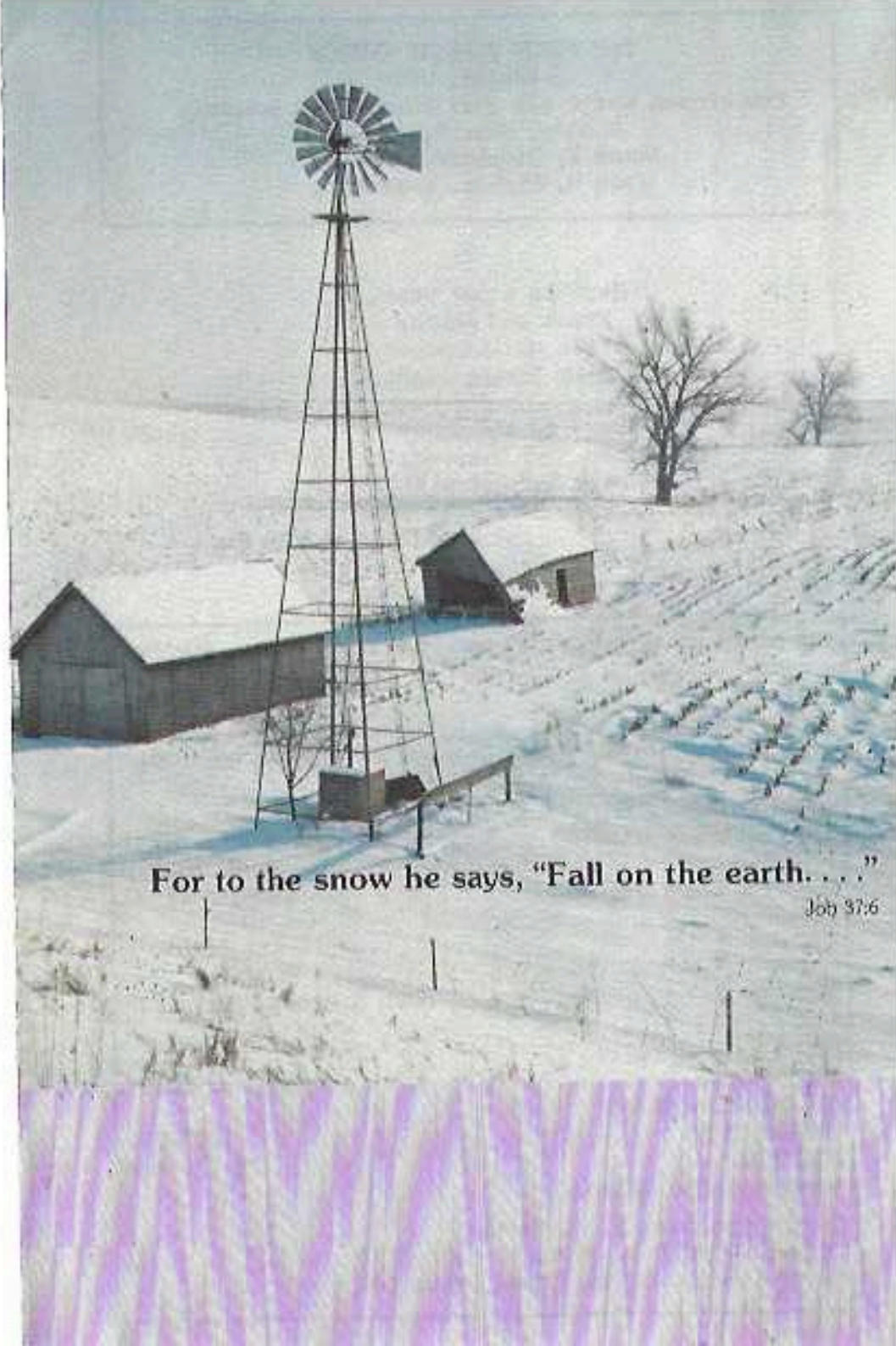

It may be prayer.


