"As for you, how fortunate you are!" (Matthew 13:16, GNB).



They were gathered at the lake that they knew and loved so well and that nourished them in several significant ways. Their number was few; their labor was routine and that particular night unrewarding.



My Neighbor, My Mission. What an exciting challenge this year's theme is! Having received God's love, we respond in kind to God and share this reconciling love with our neighbors.

Our mission is to share with all our neighbors: the people next door, the homeless, the refugee, the college student, the coworker, our Sunday School and Vacation Bible School students, the rural and urban dwellers, those who have never been to church, legislators and company stockholders, those serving in the armed forces, abused and neglected children, to name a few.

How can one person or church reach so many neighbors? By joining with other American Baptists in the America for Christ Offering, you minister to your neighbors in the United States and Puerto Rico. This offering supports the work of American Baptist Regions, Educational Ministries, and National Ministries—and is divided equally among them. Their mission efforts train us to share with our neighbors, as well as providing spiritual, physical, and emotional help directly to those needing God's touch.

The national goal this year is \$2,250,000. The need is great. Won't you give generously to reach your neighbors this year?

Mystery lies all about us. Christ rose from the dead, but we cannot explain his resurrection. His resurrection is as mysterious as his conception by the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:20). Mystery lies about us when brown wirster gives way to green spring, when blooming flowers give their fragrant white and blue and red for us to enjoy.


James Russell Lowell wrote of this mystery in "The Vision of Sir Launfal":

Then every clod feels a stir of might, An instinct within it that reaches and towers, And groping blindly above it for light, Climbs to a soul in trees and flowers.

That "instinct within" us, that spirit that God breathed into human beings at the time they were created, first leads us to believe that we shall blossom again after this life. We believe that in the mysterious goodness of God there is a springtime when we shall live again. Christ risen, the empty tomb, confirms our hope.

Christ gives us a new era in eternity. The Old Testament begins with the first-made man, and the final word about him is in Genesis 5:5: "and he died." The New Testament introduces Jesus, who died also, but he rose again the third day. There was a difference between these two men, described in one word: "obedience." Adam did not obey God (Genesis 3:6); Jesus did (Luke 22:42). People asked Jesus how to have everlasting life, and when they asked, he called them to obey: "Follow me" (Luke 9:23; 18:22; Mark 8:34).

Fourteen-year-old Tonya is drinking not of the living water but alcohol. She is trying to get even with her mother for their lifestyle.


There are others who, instead of searching for and accepting the living water, are accepting the ways of their friends and adopting lifestyles that appear to be fun, but in reality are empty and worthless.

"Overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:21)


"Fight fire with fire" is the old saying that updates the "Eye for an eye" philosophy of conflict. That might work in a forest, yet where people are around fighting fire with fire would lead to a great conflagration. You fight fire with water. Even so you overcome evil with good, according to the Bible.

We see this demonstrated supremely in Jesus Christ. God could have responded to the evil of human sin by destroying humanity. But instead God chose the path of self-sacrificing love. God took on human flesh in Jesus Christ and died on the cross so that we could be forgiven. As Paul said, "While we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son." (Romans 5.10). God's love in Jesus Christ melted our hearts. Our evil was overcome by God's good.

Our calling is to work the same way as Christ did in the world, overcoming evil with good. Where human sin creates injustice, poverty, war, addiction, abuse, prejudice, intolerance and sorrow we as Christians must respond. We can use our energies to fight fire with fire and respond out of our own anger, pride, intolerance, and pain. Or we can let God's love control us and transform us. We can fight the fires of evil with the water of good. We can seek creative alternatives to address deep issues, build bridges of understanding, demonstrate alternative approaches to problems, and sacrifice to bring new possibilities to birth.

What can we do in our homes, workplaces, communities, nation and world to overcome evil with good? Then can we make ourselves available to God in practical ways to be channels of God's healing and liberating love?

You will succeed, but by my Spirit


(Zechariah 4:6)




But they must obey me and observe the Sabbath (Jeremiah 17:27, GNB).

We never did it that way before." Without the constraints of those words, the doors are open wide to reaching out and opening the gates for evangelism. In starting a church in New Jersey, I needed to take a different approach to make community residents aware of the new church in their town. I wrote a monthly column, "Feed the Soul," for the local newspaper. In one article, "No Tears, No Heart," I wrote of sharing one's pain and struggles by finding a caring listener. This article prompted a call to me from a woman, lonely and deserted, about to commit suicide. She did not want to go on. Through the ministry of the new church, she was able to find Christ as her personal Savior and gave her life to serving Him. She "keeps holy the Sabbath" and has not missed a worship service in two years. Her obedience comes from the transforming power of God's love.

A man in his early forties was diagnosed as having a degenerative heart disease. He needed a transplant to survive. As prayers were raised by our new congregation corporately during Sunday worship and as individuals, his heart grew stronger and stronger. The doctors could not believe the improvement. The transforming power of answered prayer was evidenced to the Christians who gathered faithfully to worship.



Take Zacchaeus, the tax collector. He was as corrupt a public official as you'd ever find. When Jesus found him, Zacchaeus was up a tree craning his skinny neck for a look at the Master. But then Jesus, to the amazement of Zacchaeus and the disgust of everyone else, told Zacchaeus, I'm coming to your house for supper.

Remember the woman at the well? Had she ever known true love? Who would have figured her for God's forgiveness?

And what about the prodigal son and his older brother? Talk about spoiled-rotten kids! How strange that the story Jesus told had a happy ending for the younger son. Those young men certainly didn't earn their father's love.

They are like us! We too have not earned God's love.

Knowing ourselves as we do, it is a great comfort to believe that Jesus also knows about us. The way he knew about Zacchaeus, the woman, and the restless, rebellious kids.

God knows about us and loves us anyway. Who can believe God knows all the dirt, all the doubt, all the mean, awful truth, and still forgives? Now we the forgiven can *also* forgive. What a relief! It's like the time, when you were very young, your mom or dad didn't punish you, even though you had it coming. Who knows why? They just didn't. But for two weeks, at least, you remembered. And made your bed. And dried the dishes.

Other things happen when you know you've been forgiven. You want to give. You want to respond. You want to love as you have been loved.

Shouldn't that make a difference when we think through our giving to God through the church? We are the forgiven. So we make our beds. We dry the dishes.

Sing a Joyful Christmas


Listen . . . Do you hear what I hear? "Jingle Bells," "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer," and yes, a jazzed-up version of "Silent Night" are already blasting out of the speakers in the shopping mall.

Look . . . Do you see what I see? Christmas decorations are already in place. Their message is clear: Shop early! Television commercials, advertisements, signs everywhere encourage you to buy your gifts while there is a good selection. Clothed in the music of the season, they whet those unrealistic expectations of "getting gifts."

What happened to Advent? What happened to that time of anticipation, thanksgiving, joy, and yes, even the mystery of God's love? Indeed, it is a challenge to tell the story of the Good News in Christmas.

Through the ages God's people have expressed their faith and feelings of thanksgiving and joy with song, dance and the use of instruments. The Hebrews expressed their faith with psalms and chants. The music of Christmas joy has its roots in Mary's Magnificat and in the music that shepherds heard, we have the song of praise to God.

As God's people in this day and age we continue to sing our praises through song. We join in with the Christmas music; yet often the meaning can be lost with the pressures of our time. Listen for the Christmas story in music. Tune your ears and senses to the message of Advent and perhaps the Christmas story in music will create a more meaningful experience that will last through the years and shine through the bombardment of the secular holiday.

I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day


I heard the bells on Christmas Day; Their old familiar carols play, And wild and sweet the words repeat; Of peace on earth, goodwill to men.
