


First there was the KKK march. Then there were a couple of racial incidents in the two local high schools. Racial graffiti was splashed across the front of the largest African-American church in the racially mixed town, the seat of one of Pennsylvania's more affluent rural counties.

Alarmed, the pastors of the town's two American Baptist churches — one mostly African-American, the other mostly white — scrambled to see how they could defuse the situation. They decided to begin with their own congregations to break down the alienation and suspicion that occur when people do not know each other.

- · The pastors exchanged pulpits on a semi-regular basis.
- The choirs sang together with special programs open to the community.
- Deacons of the two churches began holding quarterly meetings to discuss their visions of the church and its community responsibilities.
- Intergenerational and family events were held: talent shows, craft exhibits, and picnics.
- · Families were encouraged to visit each other's homes.

And it's working. The congregations are moving to build unity and become a model for the community. "There's a long way to go," said one deacon, "but we are getting there. It was about time for us to pull together and 'let our light shine' so the world can see that we are one in the Spirit."



- · an experience of learning and inspiration.


But most of all, Green Lake has been for countless people "A Place of Renewal."

#### **America for Christ**


When I was a child, my father would often remind me that I must "be good" because in whatever I did, I would be representing him. That was a heavy responsibility to carry. I knew that if I tried anything, I might bring embarrassment to my father, and I knew that I would hear about it when I got home.

As Christian disciples, we are linked with Christ as I was linked with my father. Jesus in his ultimate act of love on the cross showed us a way to live today. Paul writing to the Ephesians said, "Live in love, as Christ loved us...." (5:2, NRSV). Jesus first loved us and thus made his "offering and sacrifice to God." And because Christ loved us, we must today live and walk in love in the name of Christ.

"Walking in love" is no easy task. It means that we both speak about God's love and become involved actively in making God's love known and available to everybody. At the 1996 National Senior High conferences, youth were challenged to live out their faith as world changers. They believed that as young people, they, too, could make a difference in the world, at home as well as in other countries. Youth were able to study about and recommend ways that mission projects could serve their communities better. At the end of the experience, the youth were excited and empowered to return to their own communities to be world changers. They learned that they can "walk in love as Christ loved us." A youth from West Virginia said, "Not only was the conference a wonderful opportunity to meet people from all over the country, but it also allowed the Spirit of the Lord to work through us and bond us together."


A small church in Kinshasa has a ministry for persons with AIDS. On a recent Sunday morning, Miriam and I listened spellbound to the testimony of a Zairean army captain:

"I grew up in this part of Kinshasa. I knew every bar and most of the pretty girls. After finishing high school, I joined the army and soon became a captain. I married and had two children—who both died before reaching the age of two. In 1985 my wife and I became ill. We had frequent infections; we could not eat. My weight dropped to 100 pounds—and my wife, less than 80! In 1986 we were both diagnosed as having AIDS. I couldn't eat or sleep—I wanted to die quickly.

"But some of you came and visited us. You prayed with us and told us about Jesus, who saves and heals. On that day I accepted Christ. I slept soundly that night for the first time in two months. In the morning our appetites had returned. We began gaining weight and soon our health returned. We then wondered if we could have more children. You prayed with us that God would hear our prayers. God has since given us three lovely children—all of whom are healthy and HIV negative. I now weigh 155 pounds and continue as an officer. Thank you for having introduced us to Jesus."

Medical science is now showing what Proverbs 14:30 has told us all along: A heart at peace gives life to the body (NIV). The power of the living Christ in the heart of a person has physical as well as psychological and spiritual effects. We have Good News to share with sick persons, and there is hope even for those with AIDS. The Lord does hear our prayers.

## Church Vocations Sunday The Challenges and Celebration of the Call

Annually American Baptists lift up the importance of church vocations and the role of the local congregation as the sending agent. Vocational leaders are the ordained and the nonordained who serve as pastors, educational specialists, chaplains, pastoral counselors, and workers in other specialized ministries. The source of such leadership is the very churches that benefit from these ministries, directly or indirectly.

The local church has an important place in the calling and support of women and men through the calling process. First, there is the *identification* of those who have the potential for and may show interest in giving leadership in ministry. They may be youth or mature leaders who are questioning their vocational direction. Second, there is the *challenge* to consider the call. Through activities such as worship, service projects, and Bible study, vocational ministry is lifted up. There are those congregational encouragers who support persons as they consider God's call. Finally, there is the need to provide *support* to those who respond to the vocational ministry call. Throughout the journey into ministry, there is the need for words of encouragement and prayer and for financial support during the training period.

The Easter lily reminds us of the glorious joy that is ours because of the resurrection of our Lord. The flower both looks beautiful and smells wonderfully sweet!


Dr. Clay Woodbury, who has a passion for Bible storytelling, once recommended that I consider telling the passion story from the Gospel of Mark as I worked in Japan. If your Bible was printed recently, it probably notes that in the earliest, most reliable manuscripts of Mark's Gospel, chapter 16 actually ends with verse 8. That verse reads, "So they [the three women] went out and ran from the tomb, distressed and terrified. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid" (GNB).

Dr. Woodbury suggested that Japanese Christians might relate well to this "ending," since the history of the church in Japan is so troubled, and it is so tough for Christians there to express and maintain their faith in a 99 percent non-Christian culture.

I'm reminded of my Japanese Christian friend Mr. "E," a physics professor. Although he had considered himself a Christian for many years, he harbored private doubts about the truth of the resurrection of Christ. He felt ashamed and afraid that he was still incomplete in his faith. Yet, he shared with me the new freedom and sense of hope he gained when, by faith, he came to a place of total confidence in God's power and love as expressed in the resurrection miracle!

For Mr. "E" the Easter lily is a reminder of the joy of God's perfect love and mercy shown to us through Jesus Christ.



In 1996 the Board of Directors of Kodiak Baptist Mission voted to decline state funding for residential treatment of troubled youth and to explore new directions for mission. With the funding, the state had placed restrictions on Kodiak's Christian ministry. In a bold step of faith, new ministries are being launched to help children in dysfunctional families.

Beautiful it is to see spring's hand embracing the mountain side, pushing back the snow until once again Kodiak is an emerald isle with only a patch of snow here and there to remind us of winter past.

Beautiful it is to see God's work in a child, melting despair and bringing hope with God's promise — "See, I am making all things new" (Revelation 21:5).


From the time he can remember, Naresh Singh realized he was poor, orphaned, and the victim of a crippling illness—polio. When he was just a youngster, the mysterious forces of life brought him to the Government Juvenile Home for Delinquent Boys in Ranipet, a small town in South India. These tragedies prompted him to look at life with vengeance and to become the most difficult child in the "home" of 600 boys.

But that's where Naresh came in contact with the Reverend Paul Narayana Rao, then the moral and religious instructor of the home and now a member of the chaplaincy department of CMC Hospital, Vellore. Rev. Paul's ministry of love to the children at Ranipet sowed seeds of Christ's transforming love in Naresh's heart. It took some years and the compassionate caring of others, together with Rev. Paul, for those seeds to germinate. Eight years ago, Naresh opened himself fully to Christ and was baptized, taking the name of Peter.

Wondrously, the highlight of the annual Christmas celebration at the Government Juvenile Home a few years ago was a message given by Peter Naresh Singh, who had by then become a seminary student. CMC's current head chaplain, the Reverend George Isaac, was deeply touched by the message of the former resident of the institution.

On his way back to Vellore, Rev. Isaac prayed, "Lord, I thank you for having given me one of the most memorable Christmas experiences of my life through this celebration with the children of the Ranipet Home. These children need our love, Lord. Help us to love them by sharing our time, talents, and resources with them that they may experience your love through our ministry."

One of the biggest hopes of children at Neighborhood Ministries is to go to camp. Each year the number of children who can go depends on how much camp scholarship aid we receive. I believe some people think, "Sure, camp is fun for kids. But I want to support a ministry that's making a real difference." I used to think the same way—until I became a camp counselor and met "Ben."

Ben had just come through a program for children in the Chicago area who had served time in a youth correctional facility and were ready to move to a foster home or youth shelter. Ben was in my group and put me to the test every minute of every day. I did my best to show Christian love (and restraint), but those attempts were always met with defiance and indifference. When Ben left camp at the end of the week, neither one of us said good-bye. I felt utterly defeated, believing the week had been useless.


That feeling stayed with me for a whole year until I returned the following summer to work as a program coordinator. As I was registering families, a young man ran up to my table. Ben gave me a big hug (in front of his friends) and told them I was his buddy.

The camping week I thought had been a waste, God had meant for good. It was a time when Ben received much-needed attention. He was a new person.

Many of our children have similar stories. The changes that happen at camp truly are miracles.




Our church has been one of the leading groups in "Vigil Against Violence," a grass-roots antiviolence movement of churches and community organizations. Among the means we employ are candlelight vigils, held on the first Sunday of each month, at which we gather and read the names of those killed on the South Side of Chicago during each year. In 1994 we read 451 names; in 1995, we read 504 names.

We are trying to help one another — and our society — to wake up. To wake up to levels of violence that are intolerable yet are tolerated. To wake up to the ways violence and fear poison our relations, corrupt our institutions, and diminish our lives.

The vigils are occasions for making visible our resistance to these patterns of violence. They are occasions for private reflection, and they provide a vehicle for building relationships among individuals and groups seeking to develop nonviolent strategies for recovering our communities from violence.

Our vigils have embraced a day-care center that was under siege, a high school where a shooting had taken place, and a public park reclaimed from gangs. We work all day on Saturdays to restore public spaces lost to violence and decay, cleaning up vacant lots, planting gardens, and creating parks. We take very locally Isaiah's call to be "the repairer of the breech, the restorer of streets to live in" (Isaiah 58:12).



# American Baptist Heritage Sunday Write Them on the Tablet of Your Heart

Nathan Brown was born in New Hampshire in 1807. He was nurtured by his faithful Baptist family and proved to be a gifted scholar. He entered Williams College in 1824 and was inspired by its missionary tradition. After four years as a teacher and editor and preparation at Newton Theological Institution, he set sail for Burma with his wife, Eliza. His service there lasted only two years because the Mission Society chose him to begin a new work in Assam.


In 1835 the Browns set out with a printing press for a remote outpost on the Assamese frontier and plunged into linguistic and evangelistic work. Brown stood at a high, broad shelf with a quill pen to do his translating. At times he worked in a canoe on the river. He completed the New Testament in 1847. He translated several other books, wrote the first Assamese grammar book, and edited the first Assamese news magazine, the *Orunudoi*. By 1851 he had published 8,250,000 pages, including works of other missionaries.

These were years of great accomplishment and great hardship. An attack by a neighboring tribe in 1839 decimated the village. The Browns later lost two children, and Eliza had to return to the United States. In 1855, after 23 years as a missionary, Nathan returned in very poor health. He edited *The American Baptist* for fifteen years and was a strong advocate for abolition. He was one of a committee of three that met with President Lincoln just before the Emancipation Proclamation was issued.

Eliza Brown died in 1871. In 1872 Japan was opened to the West, and Nathan set sail. At 65 he embarked upon a new career. Within three months he was conducting worship services and Bible studies in Japanese. In 1879 he completed the New Testament and began a hymnal. At his death in 1886, seven churches had been established with 300 members.

Nathan Brown completed two New Testament translations, opened two pioneer mission fields, and gave over fifty years of service to American Baptists. In his biographical sketch of Nathan Brown, Albert Bennett referred to him as "Nathan Brown the loyal." He said that the key to Brown's success lies in the word *loyal*. It was indeed bound about his neck and written on his heart.



I remember twelve years ago this day. It was rainy and grey, just like it is as I write these words. Despite the weather outside, there was a song in my heart. But, like the distance between one raindrop and another in a downpour, the song and the sadness soon became intertwined. This is the anniversary of the day my father died.

I didn't know Jesus very well when Dad died in my early twenties. In a moment, I was told that someone I loved, and from whom I received love, was dead. A mistake. I was sure it was a mistake. But my own eyes proved to me that indeed his breath had been suddenly stolen. His life had been unexpectedly exhausted. Though my ability to inhale and exhale continued, I felt as though I, too, had died.

As I began to turn to Jesus with my grief and return to Jesus my celebrations, I soon became able to appreciate both life and death in a new way. When I think about my own life and inevitable death and recall my father's life and death, I am comforted. When I look at a picture such as the one on this cover and see a young life and a memorial to a life now gone, I can't help but wonder if these people, too, are Christians. I imagine that they are, and when I do, I discover that both the boy scout and myself as well as the service person and my father are very much alive. They are very much alive because of Christ, because of our faith in Christ's life, death, and resurrection! We are very much alive because of the promise that "in Christ shall all be made alive."


Are you going to have a good day today?" That is the question I was asked by a day camper as she took the time to greet me one morning.




In these texts, gentleness is seen as a "fruit of the Spirit" or as "come down from above" (James 3:15). Gentleness is an incarnation of God among the activities of our daily lives.

When we think of fathering, gentleness probably is not one of the first characteristics that comes to mind.

The text from James says that gentleness is "born of wisdom." Wisdom is not knowledge alone. It is the ability to appropriately use knowledge for the good of self and others. The gentleness that is born of wisdom is the discernment that knows how and when to restrain oneself in proportion to the needs and dignity of the other person.

For fathers, this may mean the gentle touch of wiping a tear without giving advice or problem-solving. Men, often trained by culture to be hard and firm, truly can find new life in Christ as the gift of gentleness is bestowed by God in their lives.


Paul's letter to the Philippians is really his testimony to beloved friends. His willingness to share his experiences of God's work in his life helped others to live life in what Paul viewed as the Christian way: one's immediate circumstances should not determine one's actions and attitude toward life.

Mike was a young volunteer last year. He came from West Virginia to work in the prison ministry, but he knew no Spanish. Mike told us of his desire to be a missionary, of the circumstances behind his arrival in Bolivia, and of the abundant way in which God had supplied all of his needs, including funds for his trip.

Mike arrived in Bolivia and made his way to Cochabamba without getting a visa stamped in his passport! God's fulfillment of Mike's needs continued. Mike received a call after one week in Bolivia and was told that his home church would pay for his Spanish lessons. He was also told that they wanted to support other young people so that they, too, could experience missions firsthand. His church is starting a fund to send one youth per year somewhere in the world as a volunteer missionary.

How many times this week has God satisfied your needs according to the riches and glory of Christ Jesus? And how many times have you told another person about the wonderful things God is doing in your life? Paul was in prison when he wrote his letter. Don't let the immediate circumstances in your life blind you to what God is doing for you and through you. ¡Dios les bendiga!


As they grow in their faith, Hong Kong youth involved in church cell groups are finding friendship and help to be very important commodities for life in their chaotic and changing environment.

Nobody knows what life in Hong Kong will be like after the British colony comes under China's rule on July 1, so no one can reassure the youth. But youth in some churches get help in cell groups. They worship with everybody else, but they also have their own groups of no more than twelve members each. They feel comfortable in these groups and invite non-Christian friends to participate. Under one young person's leadership, they all eagerly take part. They share their joys and problems, study the Bible, and pray. They have fun, too.

One young man, Maurice, went for the first time. "I don't know much about the Christian religion," he said. "I'm just here because my friend invited me. I want to have a good time, and I don't want to be a Christian if I can't do whatever I want to. I don't want to miss anything."

The others looked at each other knowingly. They had been there! But they have learned that the only real satisfaction in life comes from knowing Christ. This is what they are sharing with their friends. Their Christian cell groups give them light to help them see their way in a world that sometimes looks pretty uncertain.



Among the Native American culture that is tied to tradition, we as American Baptists have helped create another tradition—White Cross.


After World War I ended, two Baptist women suggested that Red Cross efforts continue to support missionaries in the United States and other countries. Today White Cross provides more than \$750,000 annually for this purpose.

At Sunlight Baptist Mission, we use White Cross supplies with every age group—for children's church, youth group, vacation Bible school, and women's sewing groups. The sewing women of Sunlight Baptist Mission seek to help others with their creations. Last year we made lap quilts for elderly dialysis patients, who travel for treatment one-and-a-half hours each way, three times a week, in a van that is not quite warm enough. We also sewed quilts for three families whose homes had burned.

As our sewing groups use the quilt blocks, cut by loving hands of American Baptist women in churches across the United States, our leadership training plan is enhanced. Sunlight has three sets of mother-daughter teams, so the tradition will be carried on.

White Cross supplies provide us with much joy, which we in turn can share with others.


Many times in our lives we feel that our boat is being rocked: a loved one is hurting, family problems arise, our job is on the verge of becoming nonexistent, economic resources are scarce. We are unable to make sense out of the circumstances of our lives and therefore have no peace.

It is during these times that we call upon God and let it be known that we also are perishing. Is Jesus sleeping? The thought crosses our minds that God is not in tune with our needs, that our prayers are not getting past the ceiling. We fail to realize that God's agenda is different than ours, and we also fail to recognize that God is very interested in our lives, although not perhaps in the way we think we would like.

In the Gospel account, Jesus was sleeping, yes, but in no way was he disinterested by what was occurring around him. Of course, as the Son of God, he had the power to change the circumstances. Don't we? Does not the Holy Spirit that dwells in us provide us with power to overcome even the most difficult times? What has happened to our faith?

From time to time we need to be reminded that God has provided us with a constant companion who will never allow us to feel alone. It ought not worry us to think that Jesus is sleeping, because the promise of the presence of the Holy Spirit still stands and will bring peace to our seemingly complex lives.


\*\*Unbelievable!" remarked Laurent Gabundu, the superior court justice of Zaire. He was visiting our hospital, the Evangelical Hospital at Vanga, and had been invited to our Saturday morning prayer breakfast and Bible study with medical staff and residents.

"You mean you start each hospital day with Bible study and prayer?" he asked. "If this is important to you who toil merely in the mechanics of medicine and surgery, how important prayer should be to one like me who must make decisions daily which affect the affairs of state and thousands of its citizens."

And so it went that morning when this distinguished visitor, appointed by the president to Zaire's highest court, shared how he had forgone prayer and Bible study in his daily life. "Your Word is a light to my path" was the theme of our study, and we were pleased that Mr. Gabundu was able to join us that morning.

Our hospital may be unique to Zairean hospitals in its religious zeal and professional standards, but the sentiments of this superior court justice should be unique to no one, regardless of profession or vocation. To lose perspective and priorities, to forget our need for heavenly direction and be so consumed by our own work and relative importance is a recipe for disappointment and the path to failure for anyone—physician, pastor, teacher, or supreme court justice.




The rich and the poor have this in common: the LORD is the maker of them all.

One beautiful Sunday morning several years ago, I worshiped in Kayelitsha, a black township on the farthest outskirts of Cape Town, South Africa. We traveled through narrow, dusty streets past tiny houses built almost on top of one another to reach our destination, the only two-story building in sight. We gathered in a small, first floor room below the pastor's quarters and sat on bare wooden benches without backs. A Bible and simple cross rested on a plain table covered with a white cloth. At the close of a service filled with joy, the spirit overflowed as people danced into the street singing. Although relegated to a distant location far from the center of the city, these people had no idea that they were anything but loved by God. They welcomed me and several others from the Baptist Peace Fellowship as brothers and sisters.

Many experiences with poor, often forgotten South Africans, Salvadorans, Nicaraguans, and Americans who have invited me into their homes and shared their lives with me have illuminated my vision of the love of God. Living a comfortable life in American society, I often forget that I am no better than anyone else. Through the constant bombardment of advertising, I have become so accustomed to the idea that the acquisition of goods will make me a better person that I often forget my equality with others before God. I find myself looking on those with more as better and aspire to have what they have. Yet the writer of this proverb reminds me that in the eyes of our Creator God, material differences disappear.



## American Baptist Women's Ministries Sunday You Can Do It! Practicing Christian Love


Completely pure gold and silver are too soft for daily use. When these pure metals are combined with small amounts of metal alloys, the resultant gold and silver mixtures are harder and more useable.

In Romans 12:9 Paul calls us to a Christ-standard completely opposite to metallurgical practices: we must acquire the softness of truly sincere love. If we are honest, such a command is difficult because, though we are God's children, we are alloyed with sin and selfishness. We are hard and lacking in love at times, because the love we profess is not pure.

In the midst of our unbalanced lives, such a standard seems too high. How can we ever reach a state of sincere, unfeigned love toward everyone around us? Practice. Paul includes two daily skills to practice in the process of learning to love sincerely: abhorring and fleeing what is evil and benefits no one and clinging and wedding oneself to those things that are good and bless everyone.

The repetitive aspect of practice may seem boring and less than inviting, until the end result is considered. Have you ever been awed by the prowess of an Olympic athlete, the skill of a consummate musician, the supple strength of a dancer, or the art of a great storyteller? Each arrived at his or her level of expertise by committing time daily to practice the necessary skills. Can we become adept at sharing a pure, softened love with others? By daily pledging to practice, "We can do it!"


## Christian Education Sunday Making All Things New

## **World Communion Sunday**

Cultural and emotional barriers often hinder the progress of the gospel. More than debate or exposition, it is the pure, compelling Word of God that crashes through the barriers erected in the heart.

Japan is a country where values such as indirectness and nonconfrontation are an integral part of the fabric of society. While some may refuse to listen in a structured church service, they may read a Bible in the solitude of their own room. For searching is a private thing that cannot be pushed.


One missionary began to offer private Bible reading sessions when he had no response to his offer of Bible study classes. It would be a slow process of just one on one. "Just reading," he reiterates to the interested party.

"You mean no one will be preaching at me? I'm not required to answer questions as if I were taking a quiz?" the seeker thinks.

But after the second session, inevitably the compelling Word of God brings to the surface questions that can no longer be contained. The missionary says, "This is just a reading session, but if you insist I will answer your questions."

Soon the "Bible reading only" rule is mutually and willfully ignored. The missionary waits for the soul to be stirred. God's Word dictates the extent of their encounter, and that Word becomes irresistible, a chosen path for another seeker to tread.


# Chaplains and Pastoral Counselors Sunday Diversity of Gifts

Today American Baptists are recognizing and celebrating Chaplains/Pastoral Counselors Sunday, using the theme "Diversity of Gifts." Many church attenders have become familiar with the 1 Corinthians text in which Paul talks about the inter-relatedness of the "body of Christ." We also know from experience that there are many different skills and gifts needed and used in each congregation.

We may not be so well informed about the diversity of settings in which American Baptist chaplains and pastoral counselors minister or the diverse gifts they need. There are nearly six hundred of these specialized missionaries related to the ABC/USA family through the American Baptist Home Mission Societies (National Ministries). Their ministry settings are almost as varied as the gifts required: chaplains in hospitals, hospices, mental health settings, prisons, at race tracks, and with the military around the world. Pastoral counselors in local churches, in specialized clinics, and in many unique settings.

These women and men come from all racial and ethnic backgrounds. All have had to earn special credentials to demonstrate their skills in their specialties. While they serve with the ecclesiastical endorsement of American Baptists, they do so without funding through the denomination. They are in mission with and for American Baptists. They have accepted the call of Jesus Christ and have committed themselves to "encourage life in Christ" through ministries of "witness, renewal, and justice."

# American Baptist Men's Sunday "Think New!"


God is doing a new thing through men and boys in American Baptist churches. New ministries, such as ABMen Disaster Relief, Man-2-Man evangelism, and ABBoys and ABYoungMen, are reaching men and boys for Christ and helping them fulfill their mission.

But serving American Baptists is not new for ABMen. We were founded 75 years ago out of a financial crisis in the denomination. Fiscal strains were so great that missionaries were in danger of being called home. Several active laymen met in Chicago in January 1922, asking, "Should the denomination survive? If so, why? If not, why not?" They set a goal to raise five million dollars that year. The group reconvened in June at First Baptist Indianapolis to discover the goal had already been exceeded. They formally organized as the National Council of Northern Baptist Men.

During the ensuing decades, ABMen raised huge sums for missions. Providing a larger gift to the Baptist family, several ABMen purchased the grounds for Green Lake Conference Center. A popular radio broadcast entitled "The Layman's Hour" is still on the air in its fiftieth year. ABMen was also instrumental in establishing the Mission Center in Valley Forge; ABMen USA was the first tenant on the site. ABMen led an interdenominational "Laymen's Movement" whose goals were to empower the laity for ministry and remove the barriers between laity and clergy.

The modern American Baptist Men's movement is further evidence that God continues to make all things new, again and again!


# **Campus Ministry Sunday God Is Present at All Times**


I live by faith in the Son of God.
—Galatians 2:20

Paul tells us that it is his day-to-day existence—the life lived in the flesh—that he lives by faith in the Son of God. Paul here makes a straightforward statement of faith as he defends his credentials as an apostle to those who seem to have turned to other teachings. At times we may be lulled into thinking that any biblical writer, particularly someone as significant as Paul, found it easy to have faith in Christ as the Son of God. Even though we consciously recognize that Jesus' early followers, whose stories we read in the Bible, suffered greatly for their faith, it still somehow seems that they must have found it easier to "live by faith" than we do.

Paul did confidently maintain his faith in Christ throughout physical suffering and dangerous encounters that threatened his very life, and we find inspiration in his example. However, we should not lose sight of the fact that his faith in Christ was forged in the tremendous upheaval that turned his life in a totally new direction—from persecutor of Christians to persecuted Christian. This was not an overnight experience; it took years before he was accepted by the Christian community and allowed to carry the gospel message. We read in a few simple words the outcome of that metamorphosis—"I live by faith in the Son of God"—and may forget the power that lies behind that statement.

These words witness to the power that we ourselves, through the mysterious and miraculous working of God in human existence, can claim as we struggle with issues and events in living out our Christian faith in daily life. Our God, who took on our humanity and lived among us for a time, showed us that our faith in Christ gives us access to the infinite power brought through the Holy Spirit. It is a power that we can claim when we know we can do nothing else on our own, when we have only questions and no answers. To state simply that we live by faith in the Son of God is to state everything. We declare that it is the way we live in the here and now even as we look ahead to life lived eternally in the presence of God.



Many times when we read the biblical story we think of the passages containing the word *you* as if they are related only to us as individuals. But the story of God's faithfulness is the story of a people—first the people of Israel and now the church. We can lose this perspective, partly because the English language does not distinguish between the singular and plural *you* and partly because of the highly individualistic focus of our society.

When we read Joshua 22:5, we should look at the context. Joshua gathered together the people of the tribes, reminding them that their past obedience to God had been demonstrated by the fact that they had never deserted their fellow Israelites. The call to continuing faithfulness in verse 5, delivered to the gathered people, is followed by the injunction to share material goods with others in the group.

God calls the church also to be a *faithful people*. We can be faithful only as we live in relationship, in community. The mystery of God as Trinity cannot be fully comprehended, but it is a deep and rich lesson that relationship is at the heart of God's reality. So let us be sure that our obedience to God, our love and our service, always recognize the plural *you*.



Sometimes we learn lessons in gratitude from those who have lost everything. Many residents of the Ohio River valley experienced such losses this March when floods forced them from their homes and took all their cherished belongings. ABMen Disaster Relief Teams joined other volunteers in Cincinnati's East End, and some of the workers learned of a remarkable story of one woman who could still give her offering to God even though it was all she had left.

Bertha Hilliard, an 85-year-old woman living on her own, was hit with eight feet of mud in the basement and standing water about four feet high in her one-story home. She was able to make it out of the house with only her purse and had to be hospitalized because of exhaustion and stress. Bertha's pastor, the Reverend Dianne Steelman of Columbia and Linwood Baptist Churches, paid her a visit that Saturday afternoon while the work crews were cleaning her home. Bertha had lost everything she owned. She cried and talked and prayed with her pastor. As Rev. Steelman was leaving, Bertha called her back. She reached for her purse, her last possession, and said, "I almost forgot. I have something for you." She pulled out a tithe envelope. "Here's my tithe for March 2. I've been worried about not getting it to the church, but I had to leave my home so quickly. Would you mind placing it in the offering for me?" The pastor was speechless. "And, pastor, my personalized tithe envelopes were in the house. Could I get another set for this year?"

Imagine losing everything you own in waves of toxic, sewage-infested mud and water and still offering your gifts to God. American Baptist men involved in disaster relief help to bring hope to those whose lives have been devastated by disaster and at the same time are privileged to hear powerful testimonies about God's goodness from people such as Bertha. God's wonderful deeds are known in all of the circumstances of life.


Sometimes things just seem to work out so that you are where you need to be and you have what you need. When that happens for me, I am aware of God working in my life. My prayer "Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth, and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long" (Psalm 25:4-5) is answered.

I was scheduled to board a plane tomorrow, but the trip was canceled. The Lord knew that I would need to be here. On Friday past, my friend died; tomorrow is Alice's funeral, and I will be the officiating minister. I've never done this before. I pray: "Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted. Relieve the troubles of my heart, and bring me out of my distress. Consider my affliction and my trouble, and forgive all my sins" (Psalm 25:16-18).

I turn to a pastor, someone who I know has "done it before" and would teach me. And he begins. The next day he returns with a Manila envelope: "This came in the mail yesterday. It's a file I left in my old office . . ." He hands it to me; it's a file of funeral services and eulogies. Later I sit down to read them, and I realize that in God's way these were sent for me, for Alice, for her family. "The friendship of the LORD is for those who fear him, and he makes his covenant known to them" (Psalm 25:14).

It is the day after the funeral, and I am reminded again: "Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way" (Psalm 25:8).



Heritage is something of value, other than property, that is passed from one generation to the next. Several generations sharing the same traditions creates a people, and shared values give that people character.



## Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus







## Student Recognition Sunday God Gave the Growth

Paul heard that the congregation in the church of Corinth was in utter turmoil. Part of the congregation wanted to follow Apollos; others chose to follow Paul. In an attempt to calm the unrest and bring harmony to the church, Paul elected to uplift the goodness he saw in the church and to downplay the negative. Just as seeds that are planted will not sprout without being watered and cultivated, so it is with our students.

When parents bring their young children to church, the seed is planted. Through programs in our churches, such as Sunday church school, junior choir, vacation church school, camping experiences, and youth groups, the seeds continue to grow and develop into beautiful plants. The love and care of the church family nurtures these young plants. Watching the plant mature and bloom brings great pleasure to the gardeners. When the time comes for the plant to be transferred to a larger garden, the security of the fence that provided protection for the tender plants is gone. The plants will be exposed to a new environment, where the soil is different and unfamiliar. Do not allow these plants to die. The church needs to continue to nurture these plants—provide fertilizer to strengthen the roots.

On this Student Recognition Sunday, I challenge you to continue to supply nourishment to our plants. Perhaps your church could send survival packages to your college students. Goodies from home received prior to exams are a welcome surprise. Greeting cards on holidays and birthdays show students that they have not been forgotten. Plan a welcome home party over Christmas break. Have returning students share in the worship services. Remember our students in prayer. For it is God who makes the plants grow, but it is the church working together that nurtures and feeds the plants.
