## One Great Hour of Sharing



Durable Slate says that work on the tower will begin as soon as their schedule permits. The project will include replacing any missing or damaged slates on the upper tower roof and repairing the roof overhang. The slate over the lower portion of the roof will be replaced along with gutters and some painting.



The cost of the project is estimated at \$49,550. We are seeking gifts, donations, and memorial contributions to offset the cost of the project. Our goal is to replenish our Capital Improvements Fund. As of May. 18th, we have received \$16,543 for the project. Your pledges and donations are appreciated.
